#### **Financial Report:**

The <u>Financial Statements</u> relate to the financial year 2018 (i.e. 12 months to 30 June 2018).

In 2018, main features were:

An increase in operating surplus ("net profit") from -\$1980.47 to +\$1451.10, a consequence of a reduced revenue (\$2305.14 to \$1925), and a big reduction in expenditures (from \$4285.61 to \$473.90). The large expenditures in the 2017 year were associated with the June 2017 Rally on the Gold Coast.

Without Rally expenditure in 2018, combined with revenue collection (almost all member subscriptions), the increase in revenue – stored as cash at bank, has resulted in a jump of net Club assets from \$4996.95 to \$6448.05.

#### **General Business:**

The newly elected President, Rob Stapely, thanked Morrie and Margaret Barrett for their valuable service to the Club. It was moved, Morrie Barrett, that Colin and Lucy Smith be appointed Life Members, seconded Luke Huntly, carried. Morrie to contact Colin and follow up with commendation. Doug brought some workshop manuals, donated to the Club for any member who wanted one. New member Peter Mayne has been looking for a P60 manual and was delighted to receive one. Doug suggested a workshop manual be provided to each new member, Ian is willing to scan manuals so copies can be sent out. It was moved by Morrie, seconded Ian, that this proposal be put into effect. Carried. The next AGM and Rally is to be held in Launceston. Iain is looking for guidance and lessons learned from the June 2017 Rally on the Gold Coast. There was discussion about using Club funds for rallys. It was agreed that Club funds were needed for common expenses like printing and trophies. Based on the Queensland experience, it was agreed that \$2000 of Club funds be allocated to assist running the 2019 AGM and Rally moved Morrie, seconded John Smith. A motion moved by Morrie and seconded by John Smith, was carried. A committee to support Iain and Leila should they request it, was formed and includes Skip, Kerry, Ian and Mandy. Timing of the 2019 AGM and Rally attracted a lot of discussion; Kerry would like to see it organised for after the Bay to Birdwood Rally (29 September 2019); the program is organised over 8 days, with day runs in Northern Tasmania (similar to the Qld events in June 2017); Rob requested that background information be published in the next issue of Swallow Tales; Doug suggested that Qld could host the 2020 AGM and runs, south of the border, perhaps in Eucha.

On the question of having more stickers produced, Skip will contact Kerry and John Pickles to have more stickers produced in WA.

Doug mentioned at the present time, anyone can access the Club's web page (and to the point where anyone can read the Newsletters, without joining the Club. It would be a step forward if there where a section where only members access, this would give Club members priority in some areas. That a website, accessible only by members be set up was moved Morrie Barrett, seconded Skip Verhagen, carried.

Doug also mentioned, in the Constitution, Appendix A is for new membership applications and Appendix B is for membership renewals. The form on the web page is for renewing members which causes confusion for new members; what is required is a common form. Also, to lift efficiency,



just one letter be sent to new members, this letter will contain the welcome together with the membership number, receipt plus windscreen sticker nd membership list (of those who agree to release of their information). A proforma letter is appended. This motion is to be considered at the next Special Meeting.

Stephen mentioned that car parts are available on the internet from Great Britain and Cyprus; he has a friend in the Citroen Club in Brisbane who can make reproduction bakelite parts. Stephen suggested a list of parts suppliers be prepared. Doug advised that quite a range of moulded rubber or plastic parts for Vedette and Aronde have been produced on the Gold Coast. Doug to make up such a list. John Pickles has said these parts could be put on ebay and orders taken to produce some production volume. Margaret considers the Club only have parts made where orders are prepaid, to avoid the Club being stuck with unsold stock. Skip suggested the Club have a Paypal account. In moving forward, Stephen volunteered to be the 'merchanding ' officer taking orders for parts the Club advertises on ebay.

**Simca Aronde Registrar:** The position of Simca Aronde Registrar was filled at the 2008 AGM by Kerry Ryan and will remain until such time as Kerry Ryan submits a formal notice that he is no longer able to fulfil this position.

**Closing of Meeting:** There being no further business, the President declared the meeting closed at 4.25pm.

#### Secretary and Treasurer's Report SCCA 2018-2019

The main features of the financial accounts in the last fiscal year are:

- Revenues were pretty stable before adding in the Rally Registration fees of \$50. This amount has increased substantially since 30 June and at 1 September was \$750.
- Expenditues were almost double, due to increased cost of newsletter production and distribution plus early expenses associated with organising the 2019 Rally. It was agreed at the 2018 AGM, that \$2000 of Club funds be made available to finance common costs of conducting the 2019 Rally. This was an early estimate and the final cost is likely to be about \$3000.
- The Balance Sheet balance Cash at Bank, stood at \$8131.34 at 30 June.


One man admiring the Simcas said he had some old photographs of them, so I invited him to send them over, and these are attached. Very interesting. Can't get any details, date etc.

With the chilly weather we are experiencing in WA, it appears the sheds are too cold to play with the old cars as I have not received any progress reports from local members. Having said that, a number of our Eastern States members have been corresponding and sharing information which will in time help to have their cars on the road and in pristine condition.

The most exciting news to come my way was word from Lucio Cesario that he has just purchased the Abarth Simca from Allan Cruikshank. You may remember from the article in the last issue that Lucio's father was the original owner who shipped the car together with his family to Australia in the early 1960's ...... the car is back home where it belongs and the restoration will begin in earnest.

A car that will not present in pristine condition is the ABARTH SIMCA 1300GT now belonging to Lucio which is to be exhibited at the "2019 MOTORCLASSICA" being held at the Royal Exhibition Building in Melbourne from 11 – 13 October 2019. Abarth cars are to be feature of the show and the 1300GT will be shown as a restoration in progress. The dates of the show fall in nicely with the finish of our Simca Rally in Tasmania and those heading home might take the opportunity to take in the show and meet our member Lucio. Of this Simca, it is interesting to know that it's the 70th year anniversary of being the first Abarth Simca to have raced in Australia and in addition to that Lucio was the first contracted driver to have raced for the Abarth/Lancia works team in 1985.


Another Simca rare to Australia is the 1000 Coupe which has been under restoration by Peter Walker and I believe is now close to completion.

to the previous Jet model but was powered by a Ford Taurus 17- M engine in front of the rear axle. When Simca took over Matra in 1969 the car changed its name to Matra-Simca 530. The Matra M was available in several versions; the LX was the deluxe model with a roof that could be removed in two sections.



























"LIFE IS GREAT"




