Basics such as distributor, carburettor, fuel pump and the front grille were removed from the vehicle along with a Rush gearbox.

A week later I was advised of some Simca parts both New Old stock and used parts were for sale at Picton, about an hour and a half drive from Winston Hills, Don Scanes and I attended to find a 1962 Simca Body in one shed (sound) and in other sheds there were crates of spare parts mostly used along with some new parts on water damaged packing's, also a number of Flash and Rush engines and gearboxes also a set of chromed conrods. 

#### The Art Deco Tour - NZ AGM Weekend

One of the highlights of the Simca AGM weekend was the Napier Art Deco Tour on the Saturday afternoon. We drove from Colin and Lucy's house into Napier wondering where on a busy Saturday afternoon we were all going to find parking in close proximately to the planned start of our Art Deco walking tour. We needn't have worried as Bertie (our guide) was there to greet us directing us to park on a pedestrian mall at the start of the street tour. Driving classic cars has parking benefits, you

get the best car parks in town. Sometimes!!

Bertie was dressed the part in his Art Deco suit, bowler hat and cane and was ready to entertain us in the streets of Napier. Art Deco was the building style used in the reconstruction of Napier following the disastrous earthquake on the 3 February 1931. The earthquake which killed 256 people was followed by large fires in and around the CBD. Bertie an actor by profession enjoys the art of storytelling and regaled us with the stories of how the fires were contained by destroying more buildings to limit the spread of the fires and of escaped prisoner(s) rescuing a bedridden hospital patient when others had tried and failed. Bertie was able to tell us about the temporary "tin down" formed soon after so that commerce could continue and then



followed how the council had planned and designed the new city; as we walked the streets he pointed out the types and styles of the buildings. Most popular was the art deco style of the time, which emphasised spare, clean lines and geometric motifs. Their modernistic design contrasted sharply with the ornate edifices of previous. Councils and planners, as always though, can never agree so there were four main styles used by four different groups of designers and architects. We also saw oddities of the construction, perhaps even a design short cut at the end of the day that a craftsman didn't expect anyone to notice but the explanation thereof has puzzled people ever since. A feature of the new city was wider streets overhanging verandas with no posts, & underground

power.

One of the characteristics of the landscape that brought the reality of the earthquake home to us was to know that the land we drove past from our accommodation into Napier each day had prior to the earthquake been a lagoon (Ahuriri lagoon) used for boating and regattas where the land rose up and is now 1300 hectres of farm land. Dave & Rose Cooper (friends of Colin & Lucy) brought pre & post





earthquake maps to show how the ground had moved and changed topography.

### The British Car Museum – NZ AGM Weekend Gerard Crombie

I've just been watching a British TV programme currently screening in NZ called "For the Love of Cars". A very enjoyable program traces classic makes and models going through a detailed restore of a particular chosen vehicle. Being a program featuring British cars it reminded me of our recent visit to the "British Car Museum" at Te Awanga as part of our Simca AGM weekend in Napier.

The museum obviously started as one large shed which it outgrew and has had several sections added at each end of the original shed which now covers quite a large area. Inside are over four hundred cars of every British make and model you can think of mainly between about 1950 and 1970. There's plenty of older and a few newer, the 1930's and 1940's are well represented but there probably not much missing from the British 50's



and 60's. Some models have one exhibit, while other significantly more, like there were thirty six Morris Minors yet all subtly different .

The first car my parents had and the first family car I remember was a 1940's Vauxhall we called



owned albeit a different colour.

I think all of our group could identify with several of the vehicles on display, some a little more than

"Gerty" which was represented there, as was their next car, a 1951 Vauxhall Velox. My own first car, the same make and model of Triumph Herald was there as was the Vauxhall Viva I





others. Colin Smith had not only owned one of the 1930's Austin's on display but had rebuilt the 1923 Dennis fire engine displayed there which is also shown in the magazine.

To fit in more, the cars were double stacked on specially made steel frames. Unfortunately the target for the display cars was variety and quantity rather than quality, but in the interests of

preserving as many makes and models as possible a laudable criterion. The bitter sweet is knowing that most in their current situation will never be mobile again and must therefore slowly deteriorate albeit that they have been prepared for long term storage e.g. even the ground level cars are lifted off their wheels. Surprisingly most cars didn't have an excessive amount of dust on them, perhaps they blow the dust off and then have adequate extractor fans to stop it resettling on the cars, maybe they do nothing more than filter the inflow of air!


